Homemade Holiday Cheer

Wanting to try a new recipe this holiday season, or join in the Handmade Holiday trend? The Columbus Public Library can help you get started!

First, learn how to make cinnamon rolls with Jackie Farrell at 2pm on Saturday, December 10 in the library's Auditorium. Sample her rolls and enter to win a "Taste of Home: Dessert Lovers" cookbook. Test your new baking skills and share some holiday cheer by delivering rolls to your neighbors.

Second, check out our collection of holiday cookbooks, decoration, and craft books. "A Very Merry Paper Christmas" by Anastasia Bosakowski is arriving soon and is sure to inspire and instruct crafters. Favorites like "Martha Stewart's Handmade Holiday Crafts" and the "Betty Crocker Christmas Cookbook" are also available.

Third, visit our online collection of over 160 magazines with Zinio Magazines. Choose recipes, decorating ideas, and craft instructions from magazines like Allrecipes, Every Day with Rachel Ray, Food Network Magazine, Taste of Home, Family Circle, Prevention, Country Living, HGTV Magazine, Do It Yourself, Quilting Arts, and Woodcraft Magazine.

To access the library's collection of Zinio Magazines visit the Digital Library page of our website, www.cplconnect.us. Click the Zinio link to browse or search. When you are ready to read a magazine, you will be prompted for your Zinio login information. If you don't already have a free account created, click sign up where you will be prompted to enter your email and create a password.

You can read these magazines on a PC in a web browser, or use a mobile device with the free Zinio for Libraries app. Always use the library's Zinio collection website to check out a new magazine and then read it in the app.

If you find any recipes or crafts that need to be printed, try out the new print services offered at your library. We have had the option to print in color or black and white from the computer lab PCs and laptops, as well as a multifunction copy machine that also scans, for quite some time. Now we are offering additional print services. Copies and prints still only cost \$0.10 per page for black & white and \$0.25 for color.

You can send print jobs from your home PC, laptop, or mobile device from anywhere and pick up the prints in the library's computer lab. Documents, images, and web pages can be sent any of three different ways: as an email attachment, uploaded to a web portal, or via the free PrinterOn app. You can send print jobs any time, and your job will be stored for 3 days. Print jobs don't print automatically though; they wait to be released by the sender. In the case of printing from your own device, jobs will be released with your email address.
