Take Reading to the Next Level with eBooks from the Columbus Public Library

The Columbus Public Library has expanded its download collection with the addition of eBooks, to our OverDrive collection, at <http://nebraska.lib.overdrive.com>. From the comfort of home, card holders can browse the collection, check out, and download eBooks and more anytime, anywhere. Users have 24/7 access to titles compatible with popular e-reading devices.

OverDrive eBooks can be read on a PC or Mac® using free reader software called Adobe® Digital Editions, and can also be transferred to popular e-reading devices like the Sony® Reader, the Barnes & Noble nook™, and the Kobo™ eReader. Many eBooks feature reflowable text which allows a user to resize the text and alter the display to fit any screen size. The Sony Reader, the nook, and the Kobo eReader are designed to look and feel like a book and are great for users on the go. The devices feature E Ink technology, a screen that reads like paper so it’s easy on the reader’s eyes.

With eBooks growing in popularity, we are excited to offer this new format in addition to thousands of audiobooks currently available. We are starting out with a great selection of best-selling eBook titles, all of which can be read on your computer or compatible portable reading device. We will continue to expand both the audiobook and eBook selections through the ongoing purchase of additional titles.

Our opening collection features 169 titles including James Paterson’s “Private”, Scott Turow’s “Innocent,” Neil Gaiman’s “The Graveyard Book”, Bill Madden’s “Steinbrenner: The Last Lion of Baseball,” and J.R.R. Tolkien’s “The Hobbit”. We also have eBooks by Karen Kingsbury, Charlaine Harris, and Beverly Cleary. We even have “Marvel Adventure” comic books.

To check-out eBooks and audiobooks, users need a valid library card, computer, and Internet connection. Once downloaded, digital media can be enjoyed on a computer and transferred to popular devices such as MP3 players, iPods®, Smartphones, and more. At the end of the lending period, titles automatically expire and are returned to the collection. The check-out time for audiobooks is 7 days and 21 days for eBooks. Users may return eBooks early.

The Columbus Public Library partners with OverDrive, Inc. (www.overdrive.com), a global leader in digital media services, and the Nebraska Library Commission, to offer the download service.
