### Digital Books From Your Library

Columbus Public Library offers three resources for downloadable books and audiobooks. All three can be used on your home computer or on smartphones and tablets with free apps. Start on the digital library page of our online catalog, [www.cplconnect.us](http://www.cplconnect.us). Under "Entertainment," the first category listed, links to Freading, OneClickdigital and Overdrive can be found with short descriptions of each service.

Freading contains a large variety of ebooks including travel guides by Lonely Planet, book club selections, comic books, SparkNotes study guides, and books in Spanish. You simply login with your library card number and can browse by category or search for a specific title or author. Each book can be checked out for two week and if you aren't finished by then simply check it out again. Each library card allows for 12 books to be checked out weekly. Books from Freading can be checked out and downloaded immediately, with no waiting lists. OneClickdigital contains both books and audiobooks that can be downloaded to your computer or mobile device. The ebook collection on OneClickdigital is composed of classic titles including authors Willa Cather, L.Frank Baum, and Mark Twain. The audiobook collection is much more extensive and includes bestsellers, as well as exclusive audiobook titles that cannot be found elsewhere online. "Go Set a Watchman" by Harper Lee and "The Invention of Wings" by Sue Monk Kidd can be found in the OneClickdigital collection. Diana Gabaldon, Alexander McCall Smith, Francine Rivers and Robyn Carr are just a few of the authors whose audiobooks can be downloaded. Items checked out by other users can be placed on hold and will be automatically checked out when it is available for you. To use OneClickdigital, you must register for a free account with them by providing your library card number, name, and email address, and creating a username and password. Overdrive contains our most extensive digital collection for books and audiobooks. We share the majority of this collection with other libraries across the state, although we do add titles that are only available for Columbus Public Library cardholders. Because of those exclusive titles, it is important that you sign in with your library card number prior to browsing or searching for an item so you see everything that is available to you. On the Nebraska Overdrive Libraries website, you can browse by subject, format (book or audiobook), or age group. You can search for a title, author, or series as well. Books can be checked out for a maximum of three weeks and audiobooks for a maximum of two weeks. If you haven't finished in that timeframe, you can checkout the item again, provided no one has placed a hold on the item.
