

A regular meeting of the Mayor and City Council of the City of Columbus, Nebraska, was convened in open and public session on April 4, 2016, at 7 p.m. in the Council Chambers, 1369 25 Avenue, Columbus, Nebraska.

Notice of this meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Columbus Telegram, with a copy of the proof of publication being on file in the office of the City Clerk. Notice of this meeting was given simultaneously to the Mayor and members of the City Council, with a copy of the acknowledgement of receipt of notice being on file in the office of the City Clerk. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the Mayor and City Council of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the public.

Consider amending the hours of service for Columbus Area Transit for which financial assistance is being sought from the Federal Transit Administration.** Moore explained that he is proposing the Columbus Area Transit service hours be changed to 8 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, due to lack of riders in the evenings. Moore further explained that there is only one patron who currently utilizes the transportation service after 5:30 p.m., three times per week for temporary employment. He noted there are no changes being proposed to the weekend hours. Augustine-Schulte pointed out that she received a phone call from the patron who uses the service in the evenings and inquired whether there was an after-hours service available. It was noted that a local taxi company is available. No public testimony was heard. The public hearing closed with a motion by Jablonski and a second by Schilling. Augustine-Schulte, Bahr, Bulkley, Jablonski, Kresha, Lohr, and Schilling voted “Aye” and none voted “Nay”. Reardon was absent.

13. **NEW BUSINESS:**
 - 13.A. **Authorization to issue Request for Proposals for Comprehensive Plan Update and Long Range Transportation Plan and Model.** Mangiamelli explained that the Comprehensive and Long Range Transportation Plans were updated thirteen years ago and there have been significant improvements made within the city since then. The updated plans will be tools utilized for planning future projects in Columbus. Nebraska Department of Roads will assist with funding of the Long Range Transportation Plan update. Authorization to issue Request for Proposals was granted with a motion by Augustine-Schulte and a second by Bahr. Augustine-Schulte, Bahr, Bulkley, Jablonski, Kresha, Lohr, and Schilling voted "Aye" and none voted "Nay". Reardon was absent.

THE CITIZENS ADVISORY REVIEW COMMITTEE was adopted with a motion by Augustine-Schulte and a second by Kresha. Augustine-Schulte, Bahr, Bulkley, Jablonski, Kresha, Lohr, and Schilling voted "Aye" and none voted "Nay". Reardon was absent. It was noted that the first six-week training session is currently in progress and approximately one-half of the participants are former employees of a company that recently closed.

18. **CONSIDERATION OF PAYROLL AND BILLS ON FILE:** Included in Consent Agenda
19. **UNFINISHED BUSINESS:**
 - 19.A. **Bids for vehicles as follows: 1) Water Utilities Division - 3/4 ton pickup with utility box, \$33,199 from Gene Steffy Ford of Columbus; and 2) Water Production Division - 1/2 ton pickup, \$26,389 from Gene Steffy Ford of Columbus.** Mangiamelli noted that these vehicles were not approved at the last meeting pending further information on the condition of the vehicles they would be replacing. Mangiamelli referred to the budget process, noted that all requests for budget items are reviewed in detail and all options are considered prior to inclusion in the budget submitted to the council for review and approval. These vehicles are front-line vehicles that need to be dependable and well-equipped for responding to emergencies in an efficient and timely manner. Sliva reported that the pickup currently used by his department receives hard wear on a daily basis and needs to be replaced despite the lower mileage and routine maintenance it has received. The pickup currently needs a significant amount of repairs and will be sold at auction. Kloke referred to the pickup used by his department, identified all repairs that are needed, and confirmed that the cost of repairs would exceed the value of the pickup. Bulkley expressed opposition to these purchases as he feels the current fleet of vehicles is sufficient. Moser referred to a report he prepared and distributed with regard to the number and age of vehicles in each department, noted that approximately one-third of the vehicles are older than the guidelines used for vehicle replacement and said the report confirms that staff has been fiscally conservative. Moser cautioned that not maintaining some type of replacement schedule could result in a significant number of vehicles having to be purchased in a fiscal year. The bids for vehicles were awarded as presented with a motion by Augustine-Schulte and a second by Bahr. Augustine-Schulte, Bahr, Jablonski, Kresha, Lohr, and Schilling voted "Aye" and Bulkley voted "Nay". Reardon was absent.
 - 19.B. **Resolution No. R16-47 approving amendment to agreement with Hewgley & Associates, Inc. in the amount of \$13,910 for professional**

services necessary to redesign the Columbus Area Transit vehicle storage facility and authorization to re-advertise for bids upon completion of the revised plans and specifications. Mangiamelli explained the events that have transpired to date. Hewgley & Associates, Inc. has agreed to reduce the amount approximately \$4,800 eliminating administrative costs. The original plan was designed with a second floor and pre-constructed concrete wall panels to fit in with the surrounding area and the proposed redesign would be a single-story, pre-engineered metal building. Bogus explained that the redesign costs are primarily for sub-consultants for mechanical, electrical, and structural work. Bulkley expressed opposition due to the significant difference between the engineer's estimate and the bids that were received.
