

A regular meeting of the Mayor and City Council of the City of Columbus, Nebraska was convened in open and public session on September 3, 2013 at 7 p.m. in the Council Chambers, 1369 25 Avenue, Columbus, Nebraska.

Notice of this meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the Columbus Telegram on August 28, 2013, with a copy of the proof of publication being on file in the office of the City Clerk. Notice of this meeting was given simultaneously to the Mayor and members of the City Council, with a copy of the acknowledgement of receipt of notice being on file in the office of the City Clerk. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the Mayor and City Council of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the public.

STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE WITH OPEN MEETINGS ACT: Mayor Moser read the following statement: "In compliance with the Open Meetings Act, Legislative Bill 898, Second Session Ninety-Ninth Legislature of Nebraska, a current copy of the Act is posted in this meeting room".

ROLL CALL: Present were Mayor Michael Moser and Council Members Beth Augustine-Schulte, Charlie Bahr, Ron Bogus, Jim Bulkley, Ron Schilling, Rich Jablonski, John Lohr and Terry Reardon.

City staff members present included City Administrator Joseph Mangiamelli, City Clerk Janelle Kline, City Attorney Stephen Hansen, Police Chief William Gumm, City Engineer David Goedeken, Finance Director Anne Kinnison, Public Property Director Doug Moore and Public Works Director Roger Buell.

PRAYER: Mayor Moser asked all to rise and Council President Schilling led in prayer.

NATIONAL ANTHEM AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: Mayor Moser asked all to remain standing and join him in the National Anthem and Pledge of Allegiance.

CONSENT AGENDA: City Administrator Mangiamelli stated that the following items are considered routine by the City Council and will be enacted by one motion. He pointed out that there will be no separate discussion of these items unless a City Council Member or a citizen so requests, in which event the item will be removed from consent status and considered in its normal sequence on the agenda.

Moved by Schilling, seconded by Augustine-Schulte, the items on the consent agenda, being routine in nature, be approved as presented. Roll call and Council Members Augustine-Schulte, Bahr, Bogus, Bulkley, Schilling, Jablonski, Lohr and Reardon voted "Aye" and none voted "Nay." Motion carried.

SPECIAL PRESENTATION – PROCLAMATION FOR SAMMY'S SUPERHEROES DECLARING SEPTEMBER 2013 AS "CHILDHOOD CANCER AWARENESS MONTH": Mayor Moser proclaimed September 2013 as "Childhood Cancer Awareness Month" on behalf of Sammy's Superheroes, a local non-profit organization working to advance awareness and research for childhood cancers. Erin Nahorny gave a history of her family's experience this past year with childhood cancer. Nahorny explained that following the diagnosis of their son, Sam, her family and friends became aware of the lack of research and funding available for childhood cancers and she said Sammy's Superheroes was created to raise awareness and funds for research. Nahorny thanked the community for all the support they have received this past year and five year old Sam Nahorny also thanked the Mayor and City Council for their support.

SPECIAL PRESENTATION – PROCLAMATION FOR AT&T'S IT CAN WAIT PUBLIC AWARENESS CAMPAIGN TO END TEXTING AND DRIVING DECLARING SEPTEMBER 19, 2013 AS "NO TEXT ON BOARD – PLEDGE DAY": Mayor Moser proclaimed September 19, 2013 as "No Text on Board – Pledge Day" on behalf of AT&T's It Can Wait Public Awareness Campaign to end texting and driving.

PUBLIC HEARING – 2013-2014 BUDGET: The Affidavit of Publication and Notice of Hearing were presented on the public hearing held for the purpose of hearing support, opposition, criticism, suggestions or observations of taxpayers relating to the proposed 2013-2014 Budget. A memorandum was also presented from Finance Director Kinnison regarding the proposed budget of \$60,883,764. Included in the packet was a draft of the forms that will be filed with Platte County and the Auditor of Public Accounts. Also included were calculations on the preliminary as well as the final assessed valuation and growth factor for 2013-2014 and updated sales tax numbers through August 2013. Kinnison pointed out that the proposed budget includes receipts of \$56,256,370, which includes property taxes of \$4,114,025, and expenditures of \$60,883,764. The following changes were incorporated into the budget as recommended by the Committee of the Whole: 1) Property taxes were adjusted after receiving final numbers from the Platte County Assessor; 2) Wages were adjusted for

the City Administrator; 3) The proposed franchise tax from Loup Power District was increased; 4) The gas tax that supports the Street and Engineering Fund was increased; 5) Allocation of sales tax for the Pawnee Plunge expansion was changed; 6) Sewer revenue was adjusted; 7) Transfer Station revenue was adjusted; and 8) Cost of the Lost Creek Parkway Warning Beacons was moved from the current fiscal year to fiscal year 2013-2014. The actual assessed valuation is \$1,265,129,876 which includes a value attributable to growth of \$14,243,175. There were no revaluations inside the city limits. The levy rate of .325186 in the final proposed budget remains the same as last year and the city's share of property tax on a \$100,000 home remains at \$325.19. City Administrator Mangiamelli pointed out that resolutions approving the fee schedule and property tax request as well as ordinances adopting the pay plan and budget will follow the public hearings.

No one spoke regarding this issue and no one appeared in opposition.

PUBLIC HEARING – PROPERTY TAX REQUEST FOR 2013-2014: The Affidavit of Publication and Notice of Hearing were presented on the public hearing held for the purpose of hearing support, opposition, criticism, suggestions or observations of taxpayers relating to setting the final tax request at a different amount than the prior year tax request. A memorandum was included from Finance Director Kinnison submitting detailed information and a staff recommendation to approve the resolution setting the property tax request at \$4,114,025. It was noted that the Mayor and Council are required to adopt this resolution as part of the budget process, which requests the levy of property taxes for the 2013-2014 fiscal year at a different amount than last year. It was further noted that if this resolution is not adopted, Nebraska law requires Platte County to set the rate at the same amount as the previous year, which was \$4,090,687.

No one spoke regarding this issue and no one appeared in opposition.

Moved by Bulkley, seconded by Schilling, the public hearing on the 2013-2014 Budget and the public hearing on the Property Tax Request for 2013-2014 be closed. Roll call and Council Members Augustine-Schulte, Bahr, Bogus, Bulkley, Schilling, Jablonski, Lohr and Reardon voted "Aye" and none voted "Nay." Motion carried.

AWARD OF QUOTE FOR WET WELL AND STRAINER REPAIRS AND REPLACEMENT FOR QUAIL RUN GOLF COURSE: A memorandum was presented from Public Property Director Moore recommending that the quote for wet well and strainer repairs and replacement for Quail Run Golf Course be awarded to The Sprinkler Company in the approximate amount of \$26,000. Moved by Bulkley, seconded by Schilling, the quote be awarded. AWARD OF QUOTE FOR COMPUTER NETWORK EQUIPMENT: A memorandum was presented from Finance Director Kinnison recommending that the quote for computer network equipment be awarded to Sirius Computer Solutions in the amount of

\$27,175.56. Moved by Bulkley, seconded by Augustine-Schulte, the quote be awarded. In response to Council Member Bulkley, Kinnison explained that Sirius Computer Solutions was the CISCO dealer who submitted the lowest quote. AWARD OF PROPOSAL FOR PRELIMINARY ANALYSIS, PROGRAMMING AND SCHEMATIC DESIGN FOR POTENTIAL USE OF VACANT BUILDING AT 3620 23 STREET FOR COMBINED POLICE AND FIRE EMERGENCY SERVICES FACILITY: A memorandum was presented from City Administrator Mangiamelli recommending that the proposal for preliminary analysis, programming and schematic design for potential use of a vacant building at 3620 23 Street for a combined Police and Fire Emergency Services Facility be awarded to RVW, Inc. in the amount of \$35,500. Moved by Schilling, seconded by Lohr, the proposal be awarded. In response to Council Member Augustine-Schulte, City Administrator Mangiamelli explained that comparison costs for renovations of the vacant building versus construction of a new facility will be included in the analysis. Council Member Bulkley pointed out that plans for a new Library/Cultural Arts Center are not impelling plans for a new combined public safety facility as the Police Department has outgrown their facility and the Fire Station is aged and deteriorating. Jason Buss, Central City and former president of Columbus Area Recreational Trails (CART), explained that CART is seeking funding assistance from the Nebraska Game and Parks Commission, Lower Loup Natural Resources District and the City of Columbus for a recreational trail on the Lost Creek drainage ditch. In response to Council Member Augustine-Schulte, City Administrator Mangiamelli said the trail will be placed on city property. Mayor Moser reported that he received phone calls from citizens who preferred the trail to be located on the south side of the embankment and he suggested that the resolution be amended to provide that both sides be considered to determine the best option. Discussion followed with regard to possible placement of the trail on the south side of the drainage ditch and concerns of potentially having to cross two bridges as well as the Lost Creek Parkway. Judy Trautwein, representative of CART, cited letters of support for the trail from numerous citizens and organizations in the community. Todd Luchsinger, 4156 3 Avenue, stated that he farms property in the area of the proposed trail and expressed concerns regarding potential liability should his equipment cause damage or harm to the trail or pedestrians utilizing the trail. City Attorney Hansen advised that a motion be made to pass and adopt the resolution followed by a motion to amend the resolution should the City Council so desire. Moved by Bulkley, seconded by Bahr, Resolution No. R13-100 be passed and adopted. Moved by Bulkley, seconded by Schilling, Resolution No. R13-100 be amended to remove the reference that the trail be located on the 'north embankment' of the Lost Creek drainage ditch. In response to Council Member Bulkley, Finance Director Kinnison explained that it was anticipated there would be an increase in the rate and said the budget included provisions for most of the 18 percent increase. Roll call and Council Members Augustine-Schulte, Bahr, Bogus, Bulkley, Schilling, Jablonski, Lohr and Reardon voted "Aye" and none voted "Nay." Motion carried.

Moved by Augustine-Schulte, seconded by Bahr, the meeting be adjourned. Roll call and Council Members Augustine-Schulte, Bahr, Bogus, Bulkley, Schilling, Jablonski, Lohr and Reardon voted "Aye" and none voted "Nay." Motion carried and the meeting was adjourned at 7:53 p.m.
